#### English Department

The Voices of Prose, edited by Frederick Candelaria and William Stafford, has just been published by McGraw-Hill Book Company. Dr. Candelaria is an associate professor in the English Department. The current issue of Prism International includes two poems and a brief statement on contemporary poetry by Dr. Candelaria. Since coming to Simon Fraser University, Dr. Candelaria has had poems accepted for publication by Canadian Forum, Edge, Evidence, Quarry, and the English Journal. He has published poetry and reviews in Northwest Review, Tri-Quarterly, Midlands, and other journals. Other publications include notes and articles on topics from Beowulf to the teaching of freshman writing, and a collection of essays co-edited with William Strange and published last Spring under the title, Perspectives on Epic.

##### Shell Oil Signing Ceremony (1)

Dr. P. D. McTaggart-Cowan, President of Simon Fraser University, and Paul L. Kartzke, President of Shell Canada Limited, today turned the first sod to commence construction of a new facility on the campus of the university. The uniquely designed Shell "Car Guard" service station, which will open later this year, will cater to the motoring needs of the faculty, staff, students and visitors.

Considerable attention was given to the creation of a building design in keeping with the established architecture of the main University buildings. The service centre will be located on the main traffic artery near the parking lots and will have a frontage of 250 feet, and a depth of 120 feet, providing another greatly needed facility for this rapidly expanding University.

Enrollment at Simon Fraser is expected to reach 5,000 students by September of this year with approximately 2,500 cars on campus daily. By 1970, the enrollment figure will have reached approximately 10,000 students and the car population will have grown to about 5,000 vehicles.

With this growth in mind, the new Shell station has been designed to offer the latest facilities and equipment for tune-up, wheel alignment and other mechanical services and will provide a complete line of the petroleum products.
