Discussion Topics: CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:

Primarily a course in public performance, with the option of focussing on other advanced studio skills. The objective is to integrate and implement the techniques acquired in the earlier studios. (studio)

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is a practical in-depth exploration of the actor's relationship to a role from the initial research and textual analysis, through rehearsal, to the closing performance. With direction from the instructor, the students will mount a mainstage production of Howard Barker's The Possibilities (Mar29-Apr8). Note: students must be available for evening and weekend rehearsals.

Grading: 30% written preparation for the role, and self-reflection (research & journal)

50% rehearsal (preparation, taking direction, ensemble work, and attitude)

20% performance (realization of character, repeatability, dependability)
