BUS 251 provides an introductory view of financial accounting in both concepts and techniques.

Course Coverage:

BUS 251 emphasizes both the use of financial accounting information and the preparation of that information. The course will cover the following topics:

- what is financial accounting?
- financial position: the balance sheet
- financial performance: the income statement
- cash flow analysis: the cash flow statement
- generally accepted accounting principles
- record keeping and control
- revenue and expense recognition in accrual accounting
- financial analysis
- accounting policy choices

Each weekly session will consist of approximately a two hour lecture and a separate one hour tutorial. The tutorials will generally be used to review various assignments and discuss the textbook and lecture notes.
