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Discussion Topics: Course Objectives:

The role of the management accountant in today\202s business organization is to provide quantitative and qualitative information to support management\202s decision making function. This course is intended to familiarize the student with the way in which financial information is used within the organization-for strategic planning, for setting transfer prices, for performance measurement and evaluation, for product development decisions, etc. The focus of the course is on the use (rather than the preparation) of managerial accounting information.
