Discussion Topics: This course examines the prehistory of British Columbia from the end of the last ice age through to contact with European explorers. It will include an overview of the geography, ethnography, culture history, and archaeology.

This will be supplemented by examination of selected topics such as early human occupation, cultural traditions, social complexity, intensification, trade, sedentism, warfare, and slavery. The class format will include lectures and films.

Grading: Students will be evaluated on the basis of two quizzes (30%), a midterm exam (40%), and a term paper (35%). Students will also be expected to participate in class discussions and provide informal discussion/summaries of their term paper research.
