This course is the first half of first year Spanish. The emphasis is on oral comprehension and basic grammar. Spanish 102 covers: present tense (regular and irregular); past tense (preterit); reflexive constructions; adjectives; direct and indirect object pronouns; numbers; everyday vocabulary, idiomatic expressions and cultural readings. Students should expect to spend approximately 6 to 8 hours in class preparation and in language laboratory activities. By the end of the semester students will have basic conversational skills.
