# Media Advisory: EduHacks 2017 draws 500 university students for 24-hour hackathon this weekend

HackHub, an *SFU Innovates* start-up based out of the VentureLabs® accelerator program, is hosting EduHacks 2017, a 24-hour education hackathon, at the Vancouver Convention Centre September 30<sup>th</sup> – October 1<sup>st</sup>.

Five hundred students from 39 North American universities will form teams to develop solutions that explore challenges such as homework management, cross cultural educational platforms, the intersection of gaming and education and personalized learning through artificial intelligence.

The winning team will receive a \$10,000 cash prize with an additional \$10,000 in services from such sponsors as Adobe, Launch Academy, VentureLabs® and Digital Ocean. These services will help the team develop its idea into a potential commercial venture.

Teams will be utilizing technologies in virtual reality, Internet of Things, big data, artificial intelligence, and robotics, as tools in their arsenal to help create their solutions from scratch. These technologies will all be made available for media to demo at the onsite Device Lab.

*SFU Innovates* was established to address Canada's innovation gap. The university-wide strategy builds on our dynamic culture and strengthens SFU's commitment to innovation and entrepreneurship. Based on SFU's vision to be Canada's engaged university, *SFU Innovates* helps students and researchers mobilize their ideas for positive social and economic impact.
