Discussion Topics: This course is intended for students interested in video as a means of artistic expression. Students will be encouraged to challenge accepted notions of video and explore the creative possibilities of multi-channel presentations, installations, performance and online broadcast.

The course will be organized around a series of workshops, screenings and group seminars whose purpose is to develop technical skills and increase awareness of the creative and conceptual possibilities of video.

Assignments and projects will be shot miniDV cameras and edited in using Final Cut Pro. The video screenings will acquaint students with the range and diversity of video art practice. There will be three assignments intended to prepare students for the technical and conceptual demands of their final project.

For their final project, students will be expected to initiate and complete a short (10 minutes or less) video project based on an idea of their own choosing. Projects that involve interdisciplinary collaborations will be encouraged. Grading: 40%: Final Project
