6 Degrees Vancouver asks: Are You Home?

Global forum brings former Governor General Adrienne Clarkson, John Ralston Saul, and more to Vancouver on April 24

On April 24, Simon Fraser University's Public Square, SFU International, the Institute for Canadian Citizenship (ICC) and Vancity, will bring a global interactive forum on inclusion and citizenship in British Columbia.

6 Degrees Vancouver will bring 250 participants together at SFU's Goldcorp Centre for the Arts for a day-long forum exploring the feeling and being of "home."

The Rt. Hon. Adrienne Clarkson, ICC co-chair, will moderate a panel discussion on belonging in Canadian society, and renowned author, philosopher, and ICC co-chair, John Ralston Saul will moderate a second panel on the role of Canadian institutions in driving and fostering inclusiveness.

"This event is about building inclusive communities and who does or does not feel at home in Canada," says Janet Webber, executive director of SFU Public Square.

"In March, our Community Summit asked what Canada's role is in the world. With 6 Degrees Vancouver, we are bringing our focus inward and asking who is at 'home' in Canada and how does that affect our national identity?"

Panel discussions will feature speakers such as journalist Angela Sterritt, writer and performer Ivan E Coyote, co-executive director of Canadian Roots Exchange Max FineDay, refugee resettlement counsellor with Immigrant Services Society of B.C. Mohammed Alsaleh, Indian Summer Festival director Sirish Rao, and filmmaker Nelofer Pazira.

Speakers will frame dinner-table conversations on a round central stage, with frequent audience interventions. The two panel discussions will be punctuated with audience exchanges, culminating in a final open forum.

The conversation follows the successful international debut of 6 Degrees in The Hague, Netherlands on April 3 and the successful inaugural 6 Degrees Citizen Space that took place in Toronto in September 2016.

Tickets to 6 Degrees Vancouver are \$50 and \$25 for students. Media are invited to attend as participants and are encouraged to RSVP in advance.

WHY IT MATTERS:

Canadians are reacting to issues on immigration, inclusion and diversity following the recent rise of populist and isolationist movements in Europe (such as Brexit) and the United States (the election of Donald Trump).

Flash points include illegal refugee crossings at the Canada/U.S. border and statements made by federal Conservative leadership candidates.

FAST FACTS:

- 40,081 Syrian refugees have been resettled in Canada as of January 29, 2017.
- According to the Department of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC), Vancouver's population is made up of the following: 52 percent born in Canada, 37 percent established immigrants, 7 percent recent immigrants, and 4 percent non-permanent residents.
- The City of Vancouver was designated a City of Reconciliation on July 8, 2014 with goals of strengthening local First Nations and urban Aboriginal relations, promoting Aboriginal peoples arts, culture, awareness, and understanding, and, incorporating First Nations and urban Aboriginal perspectives for effective City services.
- According to the Canadian Magazine of Immigration between 2000 to 2015, immigrants to British Columbia came from about 170 countries with the top four source countries being China (22.9%), India (14.7%), the Philippines (12%), South Korea (5.7%), and the United Kingdom (5.5%).
