Nearly 2,200 students are eligible to graduate during Simon Fraser University's Fall Convocation ceremonies October 5–6 – sending the number of alumni at SFU to more than 150,000. At SFU's first Convocation ceremony more than 50 years ago, just 12 degrees were conferred.

Members of the media are welcome to attend all ceremonies. A media viewing area is located on the south end of Convocation Mall, just above the stage area.

There will be two ceremonies daily at 9:45 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Each ceremony begins with a procession into Convocation Mall led by members of SFU's six-time world champion pipe band. Honorary degrees are then conferred at the start of the convocation ceremonies.

During convocation ceremonies, honorary degrees will be conferred on three distinguished individuals whose professional and voluntary contributions at home and around the world exemplify citizen engagement:

- Ivan Coyote, Doctor of Laws, Honoris Causa, (Oct. 5 at 9:45 a.m.), is an award-winning storyteller and author, and a strong advocate for Canada's LGBTQ2S community. The author of 11 critically-acclaimed books, Coyote is also an educator and renowned live performer.
- David Gillanders, Doctor of Laws, Honoris Causa, (Oct. 6 at 9:45 a.m.), is widely cited as one of Canada's best real
 estate lawyers. As founding chair of the SFU Community Corporation, he led the development of UniverCity, which is now
 emulated worldwide as a model of sustainable community building.
- Robert Arthur Williams, Doctor of Laws, Honoris Causa, (Oct. 6 at 2:30 p.m.), is an urban planner and former provincial MLA and cabinet minister. His leadership, inspiration and action over the past 60 years have helped to improve and transform B.C.'s rural and urban communities, and the lives of its citizens.
