Discussion Topics: This course covers both contemporary and past developments in curriculum and pedagogy; in order to understand contemporary issues, it is necessary to understand how curriculum and pedagogy have been developed and shaped in the past and so we will cover developments over the last 100 years. Contemporary issues of note include the role of globalization in curriculum development, cross-cultural perspectives in curriculum and pedagogy, postmodern and poststructuralist perspectives, environmental issues, orientations in curriculum toward relationality, existential and spiritual issues in curriculum. We will review readings which examine curriculum from a number of perspectives, including the environment, critical pedagogy, relationality, spirituality, the arts, cross-cultural mixing, globalization, aims and objectives, and human development. Classes will of course include dialogues about the course topics and there will be a focus on a close examination of the course readings and the ideas presented within them. Class participants will be encouraged to contribute sources (articles and media resources) they have found helpful and instructive or would like to explore further. The structure and content of the course is subject to change (and likely going to change) based on your input and our emerging needs and interests.
