Discussion Topics: This course is the first half of first year Spanish. The emphasis is on oral skills (conversation and comprehension) and basic grammar. Spanish 102 covers: adjectives; present tense (regular and irregular verbs); past tense (regular preterit verbs); direct and indirect object pronouns; numbers; everyday vocabulary; idiomatic expressions and cultural readings. Students should expect to spend approximately six to eight weekly hours in class preparation and in language laboratory activities. By the end of the semester students will have acquired basic conversational skills.
