PRELATE ON CAMPUS

The Archbishop of Canterbury will visit SFU on the afternoon of Tuesday, September 27. He will be received by President P.D. McTaggart-Cowan and the Anglican Chaplain, the Rev. Paul Moore, and arrangements are being made for the Archbishop to address students under the Dome in the Transportation Centre at 3.30 p.m.

ATHLETIC AWARDS OFFERED

Two new awards are being offered to Simon Fraser University students who show outstanding ability in football.

A scholarship of \$250 has been put up by William Adshead and an \$800 scholarship is being provided by C.B. Harmon. Both awards will be made on the basis of academic scholarship and character in addition to athletic achievement. They are open to students in any faculty.

SFU Director of Athletics Lorne Davies says: "We appreciate greatly these awards. They show that the people of Greater Vancouver are taking considerable interest in our program. Support such as this shows we have community backing in our attempt to develop Canada's finest athletic program."

DR. DUVALL TO LECTURE AT SFU

Dr. Evelyn Duvall, noted author and lecturer in the field of human relations, sex and family life, will speak on campus Thursday, September 22 at 12.30 p.m. in lecture theatre 9001.

Dr. Duvall is a member of the American Sociological Association, the Advisory Board, Child Study Association, and the Society for Research in Child Development. Some of her books are "Why Wait for Marriage?", "When you Marry", and "Family Living". In May of this year The Peak printed a satirical review of her book, "Facts of Life and Love for Teens".

Next Thursday's lecture, sponsored by SFU Chaplaincy, is open to all.

NEWS FROM SFUFACULTY-STAFF FAMILY RECREATION PROGRAM TO OPEN

A program of instruction in various recreational activities for Faculty and Staff and their families will begin in the Physical Development Centre on Friday (September 23). Here is the Friday evening program for the Fall semester:

- Folk Dance -- for adults and high school students.
Swimming -- for beginners and advanced adults and children. (Children must be 40 inches tall)
Badminton -- for adults and children - old enough to learn.
Children's games and activities -- for younger children (out of diapers, please!)

Instruction will be given from 7.00 to 8.30 p.m. for 12 weekly sessions. The period from 8.30 to 10 p.m. will be for open recreational swimming.

Registration is possible the first two Friday evenings. The fee is \$5 per individual or \$10 per family. One member of each family is required to hold a locker in the Physical Development Centre.

In addition, a scuba class is being offered for adults on Wednesdays (7 to 8.30 p.m. - consistent attendance required) and badminton for adults will be on Thursdays (8.30 to 11p.m.) There is no charge for these additional activities.

● COMPOSER ALAN HOVHANESS VISITS CAMPUS SEPTEMBER 21

Composer, conductor and organist Alan Hovhaness will be on campus for a lunch-hour 'conversation with a composer,' in the Theatre on Wednesday, September 21 at 12.45 p.m.

Hovhaness has come to Vancouver to conduct his Symphony No. 4 for wind orchestra and his Symphony No. 8 for chamber orchestra (solo piano and solo tympani) during the CBC Music Festival. He is an American of Armenian and Scottish parentage, whose works show strong middle eastern influence. He is now living in Lucerne, Switzerland, where he is working on special commissions, including a commission just completed for the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, which will premiere the work during this season. He will be composer in residence with the Seattle Symphony Orchestra for a year beginning in December.
