The program began with a comprehensive medical examination, followed by a physical fitness appraisal by Dr. Kirchner. Each member was then given a specialized exercise program designed according to his initial level of fitness. Added to the basic series of exercises is a preliminary run up to approximately one mile by most participants. The latter phase of the daily program consists of an optional activity with the majority of staff members electing a short swim, or a vigorous handball game.

On the completion of this semester, final medical examination is anticipated to assess the effects of this program on each of the members. If the Faculty reaction to such a program is positive, it will be continued. The program is available for both male and female members.
