Discussion Topics: This course will focus on the international political economy of East Asia. It will analyze the East Asian economic model "myth or miracle", the causes and consequences of the East Asian currency crisis, and the IMF's role. It will pay particular attention to the political, social and environmental implications of economic developments in East Asia. It will explore the relationship between values and development.

One four-hour seminar each week. Regular attendance and participation will be required.
