Discussion Topics: This course covers the history and political dynamics of European Integration. It examines old and new institutions of the European Union such as the Commission, the Council of Minister, the European Council, and the European Parliament. It also explores various policies in their historical and political context. The course concentrates on developments since the Single European Act of 1986, including the Maastricht and Amsterdam Treaties, the Euro, the European Security and Defence Policy, Enlargement and institutional reform. A strong theme throughout the course deals with the increasingly complex relationship between NATO and the European Security and Defence Policy.

A mixture of lectures, research-intensive paper presentations and seminar discussion. Several guest lecturers are scheduled throughout the semester.
