In Archaeology 131-3 we will explore the fundamental principles of the evolution and biological adaptation of our own species, Homo sapiens. Lastly, we will look at how paleoanthropologists interpret and reconstruct the biological and cultural adaptation of our earliest hominid ancestors.
