Discussion Topics: FPA 489-5 is an interdisciplinary studio course for advanced students who are interested in creating works in collaboration with artists from other disciplines.

Over the semester, each student will work with a minimum of 3 different collaborators on 3 different projects. Each project will be approximately 3 - 5 minutes in length, or exist in maquette, installation or other formats. Each project will be shown in class and both the process and product of each collaboration will be the focus of class discussion.

As well, the course will focus on issues surrounding collaboration in general: negotiating strategies, division of labour, sharing ideas, building trust, understanding your collaborator's art form with its particular needs, communicating your own needs, and the notion of creating a collaborative work capable of having a seemingly single vision.

Senior students from dance, music, theatre, film, and visual art are encouraged to register. This course may be used for upper division interdisciplinary studio credit in all BFA programs.
