NEWS IN BRIEF

THE DEVILS. The Simon Fraser Theatre Company's production of John Whiting's The Devils opens on Tuesday (July 25). In his most recent article in The Province's "Spotlight" James Barber writes: "The play in itself is interesting. Most of the critics, when it premiered in London as the first choice of the newly established Stratford Memorial Theatre Company were extremely enthusiastic, and 'masterpiece' was a not unusual word in many criticisms. . . This is an important and adventurous happening, a piece of local bravery which needs the support of local audience who have any interest in the world of theatre rather than a purely personal interest in what is easily seen and enjoyed. . . The Devils may frighten you, possibly revolt you, but the only way it can not affect you is by not being seen."

APPOINTED. Dr. Lauchlin Currie, who assisted President Franklin D. Roosevelt on economic matters, has been appointed visiting professor of economics for the 1967 - 68 academic year at Simon Fraser University. His appointment is effective September 1. Born in Canada, Dr. Currie took his Bachelor of Science degree from the London School of Economics and his Ph. D. from Harvard University. After teaching at Harvard, he worked as assistant to President Roosevelt and was sent as the President's personal representative on a mission to China. He headed the Lend Lease program in China. In 1949, Dr. Currie directed the first country mission despatched by the International Bank of Reconstruction and Development to study the economy of Colombia. He subsequently served in a variety of advisory positions to the Government of Colombia and is presently Professor of Economics at the National University of Colombia. At Simon Fraser, Dr. Currie will be working in the field of economic development in which he is a recognized authority. His most recent book, Accelerating Development, The Ways and the Means, was awarded a prize by the Society for International Development for the best book on economic development.

SCHOLARSHIPS. Lois A. Miyazawa, first-year education student at Simon Fraser, is the first recipient of the \$100 Japanese Canadian Centennial Scholarship, an annual award established by the Japanese Canadian Citizens' Association. Among the 13 scholarships announced by Simon Fraser is a new annual \$250 Scholarship in Education established by Mrs. Madge Hogarth. The first recipient of this scholarship is George Brent Jackson.
