Simon Fraser University and Native Education College are hosting the NEC & SFU Native Basketball tournament, a two-day event celebrating sport, culture and community—on May 20-21.

The tournament will use the First Nations tradition of friendly competition combined with cultural exhibitions to bring together 500-800 Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal basketball players, Elders, performers, venders, volunteers, families and friends. In addition, Steve Hansen, coach of the SFU men's varsity basketball team, will be in attendance along with varsity team players to facilitate two free basketball workshops for Aboriginal youth on Saturday afternoon.

The event encourages participants to learn more about the available post-secondary education opportunities that are open to them in a fun and friendly environment.

This tournament is at capacity with 31 teams registered with participants that are both men and women of all ages.

Last year's event attracted hundreds of spectators, and organizers expect this year's event will be equally popular. Aboriginal entertainment, food, crafts vendors, and elders will all once again be a part of the festivities.

- This tournament helps build and strengthen ties between the University and Aboriginal communities and is an opportunity to showcase the University environment to those who have not yet experienced it.
