Discussion Topics: A more sophisticated theoretical foundation for understanding sustainable development at the community level, including an integrated approach to environmental, economic, and social aspects of development. The course includes sections on natural and social capital and on making community policy (e.g., the role of local government, economic instruments, etc.) which are essential for the subsequent 400-level seminar courses in the program. It provides an in-depth examination of some of the major issues in SCD globally and within Canada, focusing on: (a) the social and ecological context for SCD; (b) community-based social and economic alternatives; (c) current SCD issues in Canada. Students who have taken CED 301 for credit may not take this course for further credit.
