CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:

This is primarily a course in the fundamentals of directing, leading to public performance of student-directed projects. The students are expected to integrate and implement the techniques acquired in the earlier studios. (Seminar/Studio)

Through weekly readings, discussions, and in-class exercises, students will explore issues and develop skills in theatre direction: play selection, text-analysis, staging & design, auditions & casting, rehearsal strategies, as well as communication with actors and the production team. Each student will select and direct a brief one-act play for public performance, and provide the production support for the presentation of their classmates\202 projects. Students will write a brief paper, and lead a seminar, on a \204fundamental issue\211 in directing \210 using that issue to better understand their own approach to directing. Finally, students will document, and reflect upon, their process in a directing journal.
