Talks on Social Criticism in North America

Professor T. B. Bottomore, Head of the Department of Political Science, Sociology and Anthropology, will be giving a series of eight talks commencing March 24 at 6.30 p. m. on C. B. C. (F. M.) Radio. They will be given at the same time each week and will deal with social criticism in North America.

The first four are concerned with the development of social criticism up to the 1930's and the last four talks will deal with present-day social criticism, especially in connection with social scientists.

William Stafford, recipient of the National Book Award for his book "Traveling Through the Dark", will give a reading of his poems at Simon Fraser University on Friday, April 1, in Room 3003 at 12.30 p. m.

Dr. Stafford is one of the most widely published poets in the northwest. He teaches at Lewis and Clark College in Portland, where he is Professor of English and writer-in-residence.

William Stafford is also the author of "West of your City" and another book of poems is being published in the near future. Four of Stafford's poems will appear in the first number of Simon Fraser University's West Coast Review.
