CANADA COUNCIL GRANT

Dr. A.H. Somjee, Associate Professor of Political Science at Simon Fraser University, has been awarded a grant of \$5,000 by the Canada Council for a field-study of the fourth general elections in India. India is likely to go to the polls in February 1967.

Dr. Somjee will leave for India on August 12, returning to Simon Fraser University at the end of April, 1967.

For the purposes of his study Dr. Somjee has selected a district and a middle-sized town in western India. This is an area which has been economically prosperous and politically most active. The ruling part of India, namely, the Congress, also faces a serious threat to its position in the district that he is going to study.

Dr. Somjee has had his training in political theory at the London School of Economics. He took his Ph. D. from there. Later on he applied his theoretical knowledge to the study of day-to-day politics of rural India, so as to be able to know the manner in which democracy is shaping at the grass-roots level. His study ought to throw light on the changing structure of political power in small towns and rural districts in India while they are involved in complex process of democratization.

NEW APPOINTMENT IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS & COMMERCE

Dr. Parzival Copes, Department Head, announces the appointment of Dr. Thomas T. Sekine as Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics and Commerce.

Dr. Sekine received his B. Soc. Sc. from Hitotsubashi University in Tokyo. He received his M. A. in Economics from McGill University in Montreal, where he had studied under a Canada Council Scholarship, and his Ph. D. degree from the London School of Economics.

The fields of economics in which Dr. Sekine is most interested are international trade, economic theory and mathematical economics.

Dr. Sekine served in the Statistical Office of United Nations Headquarters and has taught economics at Sir George Williams University in Montreal. At present Dr. Sekine is completing work as a research associate at the University of Birmingham It is expected that Dr. Sekine will be arriving in Vancouver late in June.
