Discussion Topics: This is a course in the fundamentals of directing, leading to public performance of student-directed projects. Students are expected to integrate and implement the techniques acquired in earlier studio courses. This course is designed to follow the directors process from inception through rehearsal to performance. Selected students will cast rehearse and produce a short one act play chosen in consultation with the instructor. Through a series of seminars on topics relevant to the directors process, students will both lead and take part in discussions based on assigned readings and issues arising within the work. Students will keep a production journal and write a brief paper.
