

SCIENCE APPOINTMENT ANNOUNCED



DR. RIECKHOFF

Dr. Klaus E. Rieckhoff, Professor of Physics, has been appointed Acting Dean of Science. The announcement was made by the President, Dr. P. D. McTaggart-Cowan.

Professor Rieckhoff joined the University in August last year. He obtained his B.Sc. with First Class Honors in Physics and Mathematics from the University of British Columbia in 1958. He pursued his graduate studies in physics at UBC, receiving his M.Sc. in 1959 and Ph.D. in 1962.

From 1962 until his appointment to SFU, Professor Rieckhoff was a research staff member at the I. B. M. Research Laboratory, San Jose, California.

TOP BASKETBALL GIRLS TRAIN HERE
