NEWS IN BRIEF

DEGREES AWARDED. The Senate has awarded three more Mastersdegrees, bringing the total to six since the University opened. Mr. Geoff Mercer, B.A. (Hons.) Durham, has been awarded his Master of Arts degree. For his thesis he undertook a study of the political party organization in a federal riding. Members of the examining committee were Prof. T.B. Bottomore, Prof. R.T. McKenzie (Professor of Sociology, London School of Economics) and Dr. M. Robin. The M.Sc. degree has been awarded to Mr. Choy-Leong Hew, who received his B.Sc. from Nanyang University, Singapore, and Mr. D.G. Wallen, B.Sc. and B. Ed. (Dalhousie). Mr. Hew, who transferred from the University of Manitoba to the Simon Fraser Chemistry Department in September, 1965, completed his thesis on "Comparative Studies on an Alien Genome Combinant. Structural Investigation of Starch Components." The examining committee comprised Drs. A.M. Unrau (chairman and research supervisor), K. N. Slessor, E. J. Wells and Y. L. Chow. Mr. Wallen, Biological Sciences Department, completed his thesis on "Permeation of Single Large Cells of Nitella flexilis by Amino Acids and Sugars." Members of the examining committee were Drs.L.D. Druehl (chairman), C.D. Nelson (senior supervisor), L.M. Srivastava and A. P. van Overbeeke.

TOP POETS. Two distinguished poets will be at Simon Fraser this week -Canadian poet Earle Birney appearing in the Theatre on Thursday (March 16) at 12.45 p.m. and Josephine Miles in Room 9002 on Friday (March 17) at 12.30 p.m. After many years as a professor of English at UBC, Earle Birney was two years ago appointed the first Writer-in-Residence at the University of Toronto. His David and Other Poems, 1942, and Now Is The Time, 1945, both won the Governor-General's Award for Poetry. His 1949 novel Turvey won the Stephen Leacock Medal for Humour. Josephine Miles is one of the most published poets and scholars in the U.S. Her Poems, 1930-60, drawn from several previous volumes of poetry, was published by Indiana University Press in 1960. Her many scholarly works include The Poem; a Critical Anthology, 1959, Ralph Waldo Emerson, 1964, and The Continuity of Poetic Language, 1965.

COACHING CLINIC. The Department of Athletics will hold its second annual Football "Coaching" Clinic in the University Theatre on Saturday, March 18. Registration begins at 8.00 a.m. and will be followed by the clinic and a Smorgasbord Dinner and Refreshments from 5.30 to 7.00 p.m. Heading the list of clinicians will be Don Coryell, Head Football Coach of San Diego State "Aztecs". This past season his team was the Number One ranked small college team in the United States. Other head coaches speaking are Roy Carlson (Pacific Lutheran University), Lee Bofto (Wenatchee Washington High School), Dick Huselton (Foster High School, Seattle, Washington), and Rich Schmid (Burnaby South High School).
