NEWS IN BRIEF

VISITING PROFESSOR. Dr. Ronald Miller, Head of the Geography Department and Dean of Science at the University of Glasgow, has been appointed visiting professor of geography for the spring semester at Simon Fraser. Dr. Miller, a graduate of the University of Edinburgh, has taught at Manchester and Edinburgh Universities and was Superintendent of Education in Nigeria for several years. He is an authority on David Livingstone and Mungo Park. For some years he has been chairman of the editorial committee of the Scottish Geographical Magazine and a council member of leading geographical societies and institutes in the United Kingdom. At Simon Fraser Dr. Miller will teach undergraduate and graduate courses on Intertropical Africa.

BAGGED LANDSCAPE SHARES CENTENNIAL AWARD. A bagged landscape by SFU Visual Arts Co-ordinator Iain Baxter will share the \$1500 Painting Purchase Award offered by the Centennial Committee. Mr. Baxter's work is a "plastic landscape heat-sealed in an inflated vinyl bag which contains water." It forms part of the Painting '66 show at the Vancouver Art Gallery through January 8. The Painting '66 show was juried by Arnold Rockman, Toronto critic who recently visited Simon Fraser.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS HERE. The 1967 Canadian Indoor Open Diving Championships will be held at Simon Fraser on Saturday and Sunday, January 7 and 8. The Canadian national diving clinic opens with an all-day session at Simon Fraser on Friday, January 6, and continues with morning sessions over the weekend. Featured speaker at the clinic is Hobie Billingsley, diving coach of Indiana University.
