Fonds Title: Harrison Brown Fonds

Dates: 1914-2002

Extent: 1.65 m of textual records and other material

Biographical Sketch:

George Harrison Brown was born in Surrey, England, in 1893. Like many of his peers he went by his middle name and was known to all as Harrison Brown. In 1914, at the age of 21, he enlisted in the British Army and saw active service in France for the duration of the First World War. After the War he lived in London and Paris and became associated with the American Committee for the Outlawry of War. During this period he travelled extensively within Europe, working with the staff of the League of Nations and foreign ministries. The work of the Committee was wound up when the Kellogg-Briand Pact (Treaty of Paris, 1928), was enacted.

He then became a free lance journalist and writer, writing for the *Evening Standard*, the *New Chronicle*, the *New Statesman*, the *Fortnightly Review*, and numerous other publications, and also broadcasting several radio series for the *BBC*. He lived in Germany from 1929 to 1933, leaving several months after Adolf Hitler came to power and spent the next few years writing about the rise of fascism and made numerous lecturing tours to university campuses in the United States and Canada, under the auspices of The Institute of International Education.

In 1936-1937 he made an extensive journey through Scandinavia, the USSR, Japan, Korea, and China. In China he travelled to Sian where he interviewed the young Marshall Chang Hsueh Liang, two days before he infamously kidnapped Chiang Kai Shek and obtained from him a change in Kuomintang policy in order to unite the nation against the Japanese invasion. During this period Brown kept a detailed journal and took hundreds of photographs which chronicled his travels. This would later take the form of an unpublished manuscript.

In 1937 Brown moved permanently to Hornby Island, British Columbia, with his common law wife Hilary Brown, an accomplished author. Here they established the Heron Rocks Campsite which later became a Co-op. In 1940 Brown ran unsuccessfully as the candidate for the C.C.F. in the Comox - Alberni riding.

Brown became a Canadian citizen and continued to write articles and short stories. He died in September 1977 at the age of the 84.

Custodial History:

The material was collected and maintained by Brown until his death in 1977. After this period Hilary Brown preserved the materials and donated them to Simon Fraser's University Library Special Collections and Rare Books in 2002.

Scope and Content:

The fonds consists mainly of textual materials, including correspondence and diaries. Also present are photo albums, photographs and negatives. The fonds has been arranged into the following seven series: Personal Correspondence (1934-1988), Diaries (1914-1973), Desktop Diaries (1962-1973), Personal Miscellaneous Items (1937-1978), Photographs (1927-2002), and Outlawry of War (1921-1960).

Source of title: Title based on contents of fonds.

Physical Description:

Includes 43 diaries, 12 desktop diaries, 4 photograph albums (ca. 450 photographs), ca. 993 negatives ca. 132 black and white photographs, ca. 51 contact print strips, ca. 75 contact sheets, 2 colour photographs and 2 maps.

Arrangement:

The materials were arranged according to the original filing system of the creator and to facilitate research.

Reproduction of material subject to approval by a Special Collections and Rare Books Librarian.

Scope and Content

The series consists of Brown's personal diaries which chronicle his thoughts, opinions, and comments on unfolding political events in Europe, Asia, and North America

Series 4: Desktop diaries

36 cm of textual records (12 diaries)

Scope and Content

The series consists of Brown's desktop diaries which include brief entries on daily activities, appointments, gardening and the weather.

Series 5: Personal miscellaneous items

Dates of Creation

1920-1978

Physical Description

5.5 cm of textual records and graphic material 2 maps

Scope and Content

The series consists of the creator's field books, address books, correspondence records, passports, cartoons, a scheme of appropriation, will and probate documents, and two maps of China which display the route Brown took during his tour of China.

Series 6: Photographs

Physical Description

ca. 1700 photographs

Scope and Content

The bulk of the series is comprised of photographs and negatives taken during Brown's journey to China, Korea, and Japan in 1936-1937. The photograph albums contain comments on the subject matter. Also present are photos taken in America and miscellaneous photos of Brown and other unknown individuals.

Includes 4 photograph albums (ca. 450 photographs), ca. 990 photographs: negatives, ca. 130 photographs: b&w prints, 51 photographs: contact prints, 75 photographs: contact sheets and 2 photographs: col. print.

6 cm of textual records

The series contains material that relates to Brown's role as the European representative of the American Committee of the Outlawry of War. This series includes pamphlets, correspondence, and research materials.
